HUMAN FOODS

Chocolate, xylitol-sweetened candies, raw dough, macadamia nuts, raisins, onions, garlic, and fatty trimmings are on the naughty list.

PLANTS

- ▲ Christmas tree needles can cause obstructions, and tree water can contain harmful chemicals and bacteria.
- ▲ Holly and mistletoe can cause vomiting and diarrhea.
- ▲ The entire lily plant (stem, leaves, pollen, and vase water) is extremely toxic to cats.

DECORATIONS

Electrical cords, tinsel, candles, and salt-dough ornaments should be kept out of reach.

ENTERTAINING

- ▲ Have visitors keep any medications and/or cannabis sealed and out of reach of pets.
- ▲ Provide your pet with a quiet room during festivities.
- ▲ Have your pet microchipped and ensure your contact information is up to date.

BUTTON BATTERIES

Found in toys, greeting cards, key fobs, musical books, flameless candles, etc. These can become lodged in the esophagus and cause severe burns.
